Product Use

Trust[®] 4EC herbicide is a preplant-incorporated herbicide used for the control of annual grasses and small-seeded broadleaf weeds in soybeans, cotton, wheat and other crops. Trust[®] 4EC herbicide is formulated as a liquid emulsifiable concentrate to readily mix with water. Trust[®] 4EC herbicide can be applied by chemigation for many crops and can be used with liquid fertilizer or impregnated in dry fertilizer.

As the base herbicide for a sequential weed control program, Trust[®] 4EC herbicide reduces postemergence application timing risks. Trust[®] 4EC herbicide may be tank mixed with many residual herbicides to provide a broader spectrum of control and can be followed by glyphosate or other broadleaf or grass herbicides for season-long weed control on Roundup Ready[®] crops.



Application Rates

Trust[®] 4EC herbicide application rates depend on crop, soil texture, percent soil organic matter, time of application, region and tank-mix partner.

Weeds Controlled

Trust[®] 4EC herbicide controls and/or suppresses many annual grasses and some broadleaf weeds, including barnyardgrass, brome grass, carpetweed, crabgrass, foxtail (giant, green and yellow), common lambsquarters, pigweed (redroot, smooth), sandbur, seedling johnsongrass, shattercane and woolly cupgrass.

Application Timing

Generally, Trust[®] 4EC herbicide is applied before planting and incorporated. It also may be applied and incorporated in the fall in certain crops when the soil can be worked to allow thorough mixing.
